Breakfast in the hotel

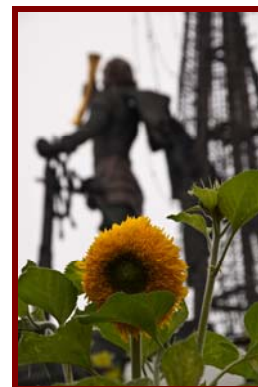
09.30 Meeting with the guide at the reception desk

- "Good Defeats Evil" - bronze sculpture of St. George the Victorious on the north lawn of the United Nations Headquarters in New York
- "To Break the Wall of Distrust" symbolizing the end of "cold war" in London, Great Britain
- monument to the Russian novelist Nikolai Gogol in Rome, Italy
- "Holocaust" sculptural composition in Jerusalem, Israel; monument to Itiro Hatoyama (2007) in Tokyo, Japan
